



Answer Key – True / False / Not Given

1. The bridge did not attract much attention when it opened in 2004.

What does this mean?

The key expression here is 'did not attract much attention.' This means that people were not interested in it or did not show much interest in it.

The passage says:

'When it was opened in 2004, it attracted worldwide interest because it was considered an engineering masterpiece, and is still considered one of the biggest engineering achievements of all time.

- This statement contradicts the information = **FALSE**

2. The Millau Viaduct is the tallest structure in France.

What does this mean?

We need to scan the text and see if there is any information about the height of the bridge and specifically about whether it is the tallest structure in France.

The passage says:

The bridge is 343 metres tall, which makes it 19 metres taller than the Eiffel Tower in Paris, and 2,460 metres long.

- The information is not found in the passage = **NOT GIVEN**

This is Not Given because although it mentions the height of the bridge and the fact is taller than the Eiffel Tower, there is no information about whether it is the tallest structure in France.



3. Drivers have to pay a fee to drive across the bridge.

What does this mean?

The key expression in the statement is 'pay a fee.' In other words, it means drivers have to pay money to use the bridge.

The passage says:

While drivers now have to **pay a toll** to use the bridge, it has cut the traveling time between Paris and southern France.

- The information matches the information in the passage = **TRUE**

The word 'toll' is a synonym for the word 'fee.'



Answer Key – Yes / No / Not Given

1. Being bilingual makes people more successful. = **NOT GIVEN**

There is no information in the passage about whether being bilingual makes you more successful.

2. The onset of dementia can be delayed by being bilingual. = **YES**

In the passage the writer says:

'There are also a number of health benefits that can be derived from being bilingual, such as the ability to recover from a stroke more quickly, or it can even slow down the effects of dementia.

The above statement agrees with what the writer says (slow down = delay).

3. All experts agree that learning two languages is most successful as a child. = **NO**

The passage says:

'What is the best age to learn another language? There seems to be a consensus among most experts that learning two languages from an early age is most effective because...'

In the passage the writer says **most** experts, and this is not the same as **all** experts.
